

## Directions for Blocker Pages

When using any Speaking of Speech game materials, the print often shows through the back of the cardstock I print them on. I needed to find a way to camouflage the back and block those images. I created a "Blocker Page" in Microsoft Word (any writing program would work) simply by creating a page of back slashes, changing the print color as desired. Any symbol pattern could be used-creating and using multiple "Blocker Pages" would allow different sets of materials to be easily sorted or identified. I also set my print margins to the smallest setting my program would allow, in order to get the most coverage on a page. After I have downloaded the materials from the website, I then flip my pages over and print the other side of the paper with my "Blocker Page."
