

Games at School

I play games in many of my classes in middle school, especially P.E., math, and speech.

The reason students play games at school is to have fun while we are learning.

When you play a game, sometimes you might win and sometimes you might lose.

Winning and losing are a part of playing games.

I like to play games at school, so I have to remind myself that when I play games at school sometimes I will win and sometimes I will lose.

Sometimes when I play games I win. That makes me feel very happy.

Sometimes when I play games I lose. That makes me feel very disappointed and angry.

Sometimes when I lose a game I feel so disappointed and angry that I cry, hit things, or throw things.

This is NOT an okay way to behave when I lose a game. Crying, hitting things, and throwing things makes other people feel upset. It makes other people think I don't know how to behave like a middle school student when I play a game and I lose.

When I lose a game, I can remind myself that it's okay to lose. Sometimes you win when you play games and sometimes you lose.

I can remind myself that the important thing is that I had fun and learned while playing the game.

If I feel disappointed and angry when I lose a game, I CANNOT cry, kick things, or throw things.

I CAN say, "It's okay to lose games sometimes. Maybe I'll win another time."

I can remind myself that games are fun to play at school even when I lose.

I like to play games at school so I can have fun while I am learning.
