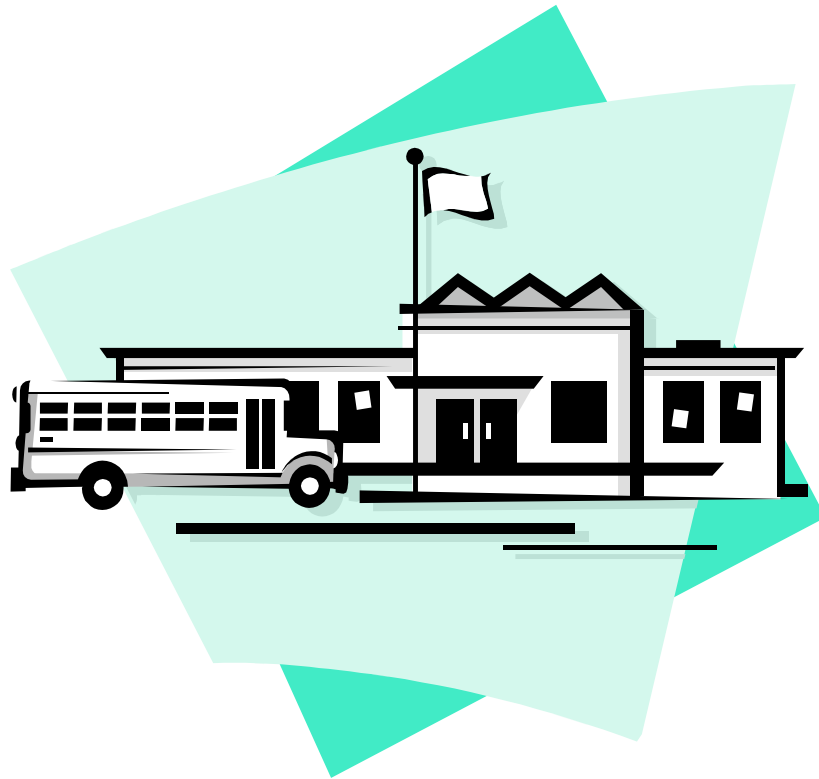


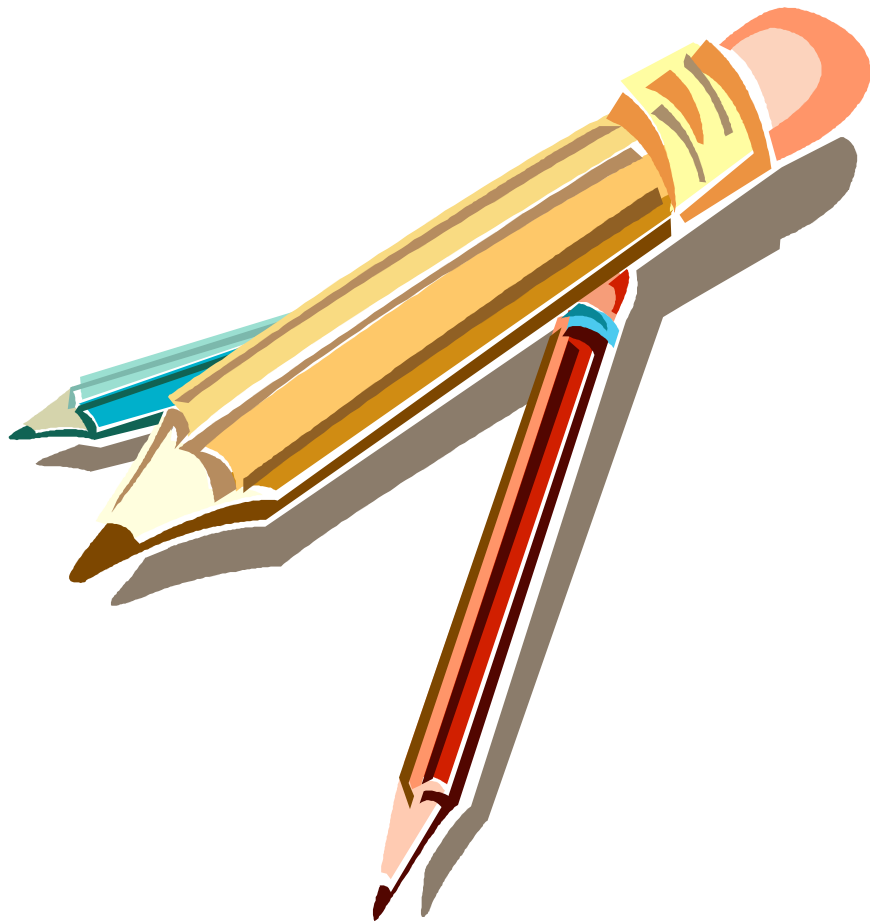
I use these types of stories all of the time with my kindergarten language groups and my special needs language groups. The kids love to “read” the story by themselves and they usually will participate with out much coaxing. I like to pre teach the lesson...asking what do you think we need to come to school. I go around the room and ask each student and then we read the book. I read with them the first time. They read it as a group the next time and then the third time I ask individual kids to read certain pages. At the end I ask wh questions and yes no questions to help comprehension. Make sure you cut and laminate this onto a piece of cardboard or construction paper for durability and ease!! Good luck!
